Dean was born March 16, 1964 in Fort Wayne, Indiana to Robert and Linda Gloy. Dean's stepfather is PGA Professional Marty R. Camacho.

Dean's father gave him a cut-down set of clubs and introduced him to golf at Fairview Golf Club in Fort Wayne, Indiana. He began playing cross-handed at the age of three. Dean was instantly hooked and played regularly from then on.

Dean received his BA degree in Political Science from Indiana University in 1987 and has also studied in the Master's Program in International Transactions at George Mason University. He worked as a Legislative Aide to US Senator Dennis DeConcini from 1987-1992. From 1992-1996 he worked in the field of international public relations where he conducted numerous political campaigns in Europe, Central America, and Africa.

Dean was certified by Jimmy Ballard to teach at the "Colbert-Ballard Golf Academy" in 1997 and became a PGA Apprentice in 1998. From 1998-1999 he was the teaching professional at East Potomac Park Golf Course in Washington, DC. From 1999-2000 Dean worked as an assistant at Montclair Golf, Tennis, and Swim Club in Montclair, Virginia. In 2001, he began working as an assistant at Augustine Golf Club in Stafford, Virginia. Dean was elected to PGA membership in April 2002. He moved to his current position as assistant PGA Professional at Cannon Ridge Golf Club in Fredericksburg, Virginia in 2003. In his current position at Cannon Ridge, Dean is in the process of implementing former PGA Tour Commissioner Deane Beman's "6/90 Teaching System", which is designed to grow the game by providing new golfers an avenue into the game.

Dean is a member of the MAPGA's Membership Committee. He is a frequent volunteer for Paul Berry's "Hooked on Golf" program for the DC Public Schools and conducts many junior and Special Olympics clinics. Dean's personal philosophy is to never forget who you are or where you came from.
