The mission of the Elite Sports Performance Junior Training Center is to raise the level of play of junior players through a commitment to improvement by the players and the Kingsmill Golf Academy Staff. The Training Center will play a key role in developing junior players potential. This focused intense training is provided for players that have a strong

desire to pursue golf to the next level. The program consists of individual instruction, golf specific fitness training, golf bio-dynamics, and supervised practice sessions. The results speak for themselves. The average stroke average per player dropped four points and their have been two tournament wins, three top fives and five top ten finishes in the first year of the program.
