Glen Pierce, PGA

The MAPGA President, Andy Weissinger, personally selects this President's Award winner to recognize an individual who has been working "under the radar," to improve our game, our industry, and our Association. Mr. Weissinger has identified Glen Pierce, PGA for his endless support of the Section, his fellow PGA professionals, the support of local charities, and the advancement of the game of golf.

Glen was born to Butch and Karen Pierce in Norfolk, Virginia on November 6, 1969. He has two siblings Craig Pierce and Stacey Pittman. A lifelong resident of Virginia Beach, his father introduced him to the game of golf at 9 years old in the field next to his childhood home. His first golf related job was at Kempsville Meadows Golf Course at the driving range. Glen received his Sport & Fitness Management degree from Campbell University where he was on the golf team from 1987-1992.

He became a golf professional in 1993 at Cypress Point Country Club before moving to a role at Stumpy Lake Golf Course. Glen was elected to PGA Membership in 1995 and became Head Professional at Heron Ridge Golf Club in 1999. In 2007, he was promoted to Director of Golf at Heron Ridge Golf Club and Virginia Beach National Golf Club.

In 2006, Glen was diagnosed with MS, an incurable disease which at the time only offered 4 different drug options to help control the symptoms of MS. Glen has been actively involved in the Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Society, serving as a Board Member for the Virginia/West Virginia Chapter from 2013-2018 earning Board Member of the Year in 2016. He received Top Fundraiser for Bike MS in the chapter from 2012 through 2022. Through time, money and research there are now over 20 drug options to help the symptoms of MS. Glen urges fellow MS patients to not give up, as everyday miracles are happening, and to keep working hard. Glen continues to work hard by staying in shape, eating healthy, and taking medications to live life to the fullest and support his family and friends in every way possible.

Glen started his own MSGolf charity event and MSBike Team charity ride in 2008 and to date has raised \$800,000 for the MS National Society/Foundation. PGA Tour Player Marc Leishman, who also lives in Virginia Beach, has held his annual fundraiser at VB National with Glen for a few years. This year was the most successful fundraising event to date with a net total of \$650,000 raised. Glen has also played in the event each time the event was hosted at VB National including this year.

Glen has been married to his wife Jennifer since 2000 and they share two children; Claire (18) and Grace (15).
